

After almost 2 months with the new English translation of the Roman Missal, I am noticing that the volume of congregational response in our churches is lower than it ever was. Most members of the assembly are completely silent when it is time for them to respond.

Please don't be silent at these times in the Mass. Mass should not just be passively attended; the faithful should consciously and actively participate at all times in the liturgy.

It is vital to use either a prayer card or a missalette in order to respond during the Mass with its newly translated prayers. Pew cards are available from the Parish Office; so far only about 40 cards have been requested. Simply visit, call, or email either parish office & one will be given or mailed to you. ---*RMP*, Adm.

The Blessing of Throats

After each Mass today, the clergy are available for the blessing of the throats in anticipation of the Feast of St. Blaise, which occurs this Fri., Feb. 3. The blessing has its origins in the story of Saint Blaise, a bishop who was martyred in Armenia in the Roman persecutions of the early 4th century AD. When Blaise was approached by a young mother whose infant was choking on a bone, he miraculously saved the child. For centuries, he has been revered as the saint of protection from diseases of the throat.

The blessing has always been accompanied by the use of two candles which are typically blessed on the Feast of the Presentation (also called Candlemas), which we celebrate on Thurs., Feb. 2nd.
