

COMING UP AT SPSA:

Getting Used to the New Translation

I strongly recommend all parishioners do the following

in order to participate fully at Mass:

Use a missalette for the readings and Eucharistic prayer. The translation of the Scriptures remains the same, but you might discover reading along with the proclamation enables you to focus better. Silently reading the Eucharistic prayer with the celebrant will enable you to better focus upon and pray the prayer. No missalette should be removed from the church.

Use a pew card for the new responses. Using a pew card with the newly translated responses of the congregation enables you to avoid much flipping through the missalette, particularly during the Introductory Rites of the Mass. You could then use the missalette just for the readings and for the Eucharistic prayer.

To obtain a pew card is quite easy: simply visit the Parish Office during office hours, or call either office and and leave a message with your name and address. or email your request to stpaulstagnes@gmail.com.

Christmas Food Vouchers

A total of 91 MetFood \$50 food vouchers were distributed before Thanksgiving and Christmas to low income and unemployed individuals and families who live within our parish boundaries. A total of \$4550 had to be spent; MetFood's Smith Street supermarket gives no discount nor donates a single voucher. The vouchers have been largely paid for out of the St. Vincent de Paul account, which is funded principally by the poor boxes at St. Paul's. A very small though generous group of parishioners at our two churches have returned envelopes totalling \$885.

Prayers for the Family at Mass Today

As we have done in past years in SPSA on the Sunday in the Octave of Christmas, today, Sun., Jan. 1st, we invite all members of the assembly to enter into the sanctuary, place their hands upon the altar, and pray for their family members, living and deceased.

Usually the Sunday in the octave is the Solemnity of the Holy Family, but this year it has been superceded by Mary. Mother of God, which is always observed on Jan. 1st. Nevertheless, the focus on the family is appropriate on this feast as well. What St. Luke says of Mary at the time of the birth of Jesus is that "she kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart."

Just as Mary reflected upon God's mysterious presence in her family, so we must do with God's presence in our families, praying for our family members and asking God to give us the grace to understand and love them as He does.
