The Ritual at Mass Today

An aspersion, a sprinkling with newly blessed water over the assembly at the Masses of Easter, is a beloved part of our liturgical tradition as Catholics. Occurring just after the renewal of our profession of faith at the Easter Vigil and at the beginning of Mass on Easter Sunday, the aspersion reminds us that the Paschal mystery which we celebrate in the Sacred Triduum, the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, is not just a supernatural fact out there in the universe. We are intimately joined to that mystery by our baptism.

A fine priest with whom I worked used to remind the people that it was not right for them to say "I was baptized," as though it was just an event that happened long ago, but better to say "I am baptized," the present tense reflecting our belief that the living waters of baptism remain with us throughout our lives, never ceasing to refresh and invigorate us with God's grace. Just as new water falls upon us each Easter, He offers new opportunities to us to allow the mystery of His Son's death and Resurrection to manifest itself in our lives.

What we do at SPSA at our Easter Masses is simply an individual aspersion as each of the faithful comes to the baptismal font to be blessed and renewed. May all of us rejoice in our intimate union with Christ that began on the day of our baptism and remains with us our entire lives. -RMP
