

Skipped Mass Last Sunday, Jan. 26th?

The Church advises you: Don't receive Communion today to avoid committing another mortal sin.

You are always welcome to attend Sunday Mass at St. Paul & St. Agnes, whatever your frequency of Mass attendance is. But I urge all (adults and children) to abide by Church law and not to receive Holy Communion again if one deliberately has missed Mass on a Sunday or a holy day of obligation until one has gone to Confession and is in the state of grace once again. **Certainly if one is ill, or if one is elderly and is danger of falling on snow or ice, the obligation is lifted, and there is no sin in remaining at home.** —RMP, Adm.

Blessing of Candles Today

It is the custom to bring candles to church on the Feast of the Presentation, February 2nd, popularly called Candlemas Or Candelaria as a reminder that the light of Christ is with us, illuminating whatever darkness we encounter in the world. The invitation to live in this light is for all people.

Blessing of Throats Today

The Feast of St. Blaise, patron invoked against throat disease, is observed tomorrow, Feb. 3. Throats are blessed on that day, Customarily with 2 candles that are blessed on Candlemas. Blaise, a bishop who was martyred in Armenia in the early 300's AD, was reputed to have saved the life of a baby who was choking on a piece of bone by blessing the child and removing the almost fatal object.

World Marriage Day: Who Can Renew Their Vows?

Couples and married individuals who are sacramentally married by the Catholic Church and those who are married only by civil authority are all welcome to renew their vows in the Masses on Feb. 8 and 9. The Catholic Church continues to endorse the Sacrament of Marriage is the only form of marriage of all Catholics who are called to marriage. The Church teaches that marriage is not only the commitment of the couple to uphold their marriage vows; it is a covenant with God who gives the couple the Spirit of the risen Jesus Christ when they say "I do" and who continues to bind that couple together in marriage. The Church continues as well to advise all Catholics who are civilly married to refrain from receiving Holy Communion or Confession until their marriages are convalidated by the Church. I support & endorse all these teachings.

However, a Catholic who makes solemn vows before a civil authority to remain together with his/her spouse for life, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health deserve the prayers and support of the Church as well as the sacramentally married do. While discerning the call to convalidate a civil marriage, a Catholic can certainly turn to the Lord and ask for His guidance and a quickening of the gifts of the Holy Spirit received at Baptism and Confirmation. Civilly married couples are also welcome to renew their vows on Feb. 8 & 9. —RMP
